2nd grade: Addition/Subtraction-Mental calculation within 1-20. Place Value


3rd to 5th Grade: Place Value/Multiplication/Division/Fractions.

As family we will.....

support students' success in reading and Math by:

- Reading with their children at least 30 minutes a day. Asking questions to promote comprehension, such as: "What do you think about this word? What is the story about?
- Assisting children with homework, helping them schedule appropriate homework time, helping them use critical thinking skills to solve problems, and encouraging them to complete and submit all their homework
- Making children practice the Math skills they are learning in their class (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, etc.)
- Asking children to help with daily activities that involve using the math skills they are learning: house projects, cooking, shopping, etc. (counting items, calculating the total cost of shopping items, calculating change, savings required to buy something, following instruction for recipes, measuring, calculating distances, etc..)
- Watching the instructional videos that teachers send, reading all communications coming from the school. Communicating with teachers to inquire about the curriculum, assignments and student progress.
- .Attending parent-teacher conferences and school events for parents (open house, curriculum nights, parent workshops, etc.)
- Asking children to practice letters and numbers in writing and identifying them in books or environmental print (ex when they go to the store asking what
